Revisiting the Legislation

(g) The administering entity, in consultation with the working group and designated organizations, shall determine how to phase in the right to counsel program based on all relevant factors, including, but not

limited to: (1) The prioritization of certain groups of individuals by income, zip codes, census tracts or other priority criteria developed in consultation with the designated organizations and the working group; (2) the availability of program funding; (3) the number of trained legal services attorneys available to provide legal representation; and (4) the scope of the need for legal representation.



- 404 referred for legal representation



Demographics cntd.



- Approximately 21% had a physical disability or handicap
- 20% had a mental disability or handicap
- 2% had a learning disability

43% report having a disability

Housing



 Of the people who responded to the question about the presence of defective conditions in their home, approximately 69% indicated there were defective conditions.

 Of the people who responded to the question about wanting to stay in their home, approximately 64% indicated they wanted to stay, approximately 31% indicated they did not want to stay, and 5% indicated they preferred not to answer.

Housing cntd.



Of the people who responded to the question about where they would stay **if they had to move**:

- ~34% indicated they would live unsheltered/on the street
- 32% did not know where they would stay
- 20% would enter shelter
- 5% would stay with friends/family in CT
- 3% would stay with friends/family outside of CT.

Tenants' Eviction History



 77% of tenants referred for legal representation report never having had an eviction filed against them.

Rental Assistance



66% of tenants who were referred for legal representation indicated they had applied for rental assistance



Approximately 72% of people who indicated their case was related to the non-payment of rent applied for rental assistance
