




Annual Filings Trends by Month

Cases Filed by Connecticut Housing Authorities 2022









Weekly case open trends




Defective Conditions


Almost 60% of RTC clients report defective conditions in their apartment.

Top Client Goals




The **top two** self-reported **client goals** are: **Prevent Eviction Judgment** at 76.2% and **Prevent Involuntary Move** at 81.9%.

So far, 'Prevent Eviction Judgment' has been achieved in 74.1% of closed, extensive services cases.

'Prevent Involuntary Move' has been achieved in 69.6% of closed, extensive services cases.

The State of Connecticut created a Right to Counsel program (CT-RTC) to provide *free legal representation* to income eligible tenants facing eviction or loss of housing subsidy.

The program began in a few communities on January 31, 2022 and will grow over time.
